For it is the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.





Instead of buying the gifts, the Unit will send enough money to buy gifts for four children.

Conde Church News

The Bishop's Thanksgiving offering is for aid to the people in Puerto Rico, and the Conde Church is encouraging members to donate to this worthwhile mission. UMCOR goes into disaster areas such as this, and works in much the same way as Salvation Army or Red Cross, however, administrative costs are covered in the One Great Hour of Sharing Special Sunday offering taken in March. When giving to an UMCOR Advance Special, it is guarantied that your money will go to help those in need.

The Congregation donated a very impressive amount of money to help North Highland Methodist Church in Aberdeen with the Shoe Box Christmas project. The Mission Committee did not try to buy gifts this year, but rather gave them the cash, and their Mission Committee will purchase what they need. Wrapping the shoe boxes with gift wrap is a time consuming process, so Donna Hearnen wrapped nine boxes to help them out. The box and the lid must be wrapped separately. North Highland Church hand delivers these gift boxes to the children at the Enemy Swim Indian School. All of the work they do is volunteer service, so there is no administrative costs.

Conde Church will not have services on Sunday morning December 24, but there will be a Christmas Eve service at 5:00.

Pastor Thomas Carlson:




UMW Annual Christmas Goodies Packages

If our greatest need had been information, God would have sent us an educator.



President Brad Morehouse was absent, so the board agreed that Diann Morehouse would be the acting Vice Chair. The meeting was called to order at 7:00pm. There were 10 members in attendance.

Anita Lowary presented an October UMC Financial Report. It was noted that receipts from the October 29 Church Dinner were \$1905 while receipts from the silent auction on that day were \$689.50. Also noted, y-t-d expenses have been \$4,892.43 more than income. In addition, we are behind in apportionment payments by \$2500 to our conference.

Anita Lowary reviewed the 2018 proposed budget showing a comparison to the 2017 budget. Anita noted that everything has been cut drastically for 2018. We will need to do some serious fundraising to help sustain our activities.

The Administrative Council also approved Angela Dobbin's request to hold a November 11 Kids Ministry Chili/Soup Cook -off and Vendor Event at our church with all money going to our children's ministry. There will be a free will donation for chili and soup and each vendor will pay \$15 for their vendor spot.

In preparation for the annual Charge Conference, the council approved the list of nominations for the Groton council leadership and committee members as presented by Pastor Thomas.

Jolene & Alan Townsend volunteered to purchase and hang fresh greenery around the church doors this Christmas season. The council was happy to approve their offer.

After a short discussion all agreed that the Groton church would hold their normal Sunday morning service on Sunday, December 24 along with the traditional Christmas Eve service that evening.

Laurie Mitchell, Trustees Chair, stated that the pipe leak in the fellowship hall would be fixed as soon as a part arrives. The Trustees were also given permission to complete painting of the walls in the fellowship hall. Thanks to those who are donating all materials and labor to give the room a fresh look.

Karla Pasteur, Missions Chair, explained their idea for collecting meal items for a Thanksgiving Blessing and the council gave her their approval for the project.




The Perfect Gift
