## From Pastor Thomas' Desk

Greeting friends,

As I was thinking about the new year with new opportunities. There were three bible passages that really can to mind;

First - Matthew 14:28-31,

Peter answered him, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." He said, "Come." So Peter got out of the boat, started walking on the water, and came toward Jesus. But when he noticed the strong wind, he became frightened, and beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him, saying to him, "You of little faith, why did you doubt?"



The second passage is John 15:5-9, I am the vine, you are the branches. Those

who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples. As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love.

The Third and Final passage is Matthew 28:19-20,

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

### **Groton Finance**

As we begin the new year of 2018, it's time to reflect on what is important in our lives and changes we can make to support those important things. One item of importance to most people is their church. While we might think that our Groton UMC has always been here for us in the past and will always be here in the future, that is not necessarily the case without the support of its members. That support can come in many different forms, but the one area that needs to be addressed occasionally is our financial support of the church.

Over the last several years the church finances have been treading water, but now they are slowly slipping below the surface. Several UMC Conference payments have be missed this year in order to have enough money for us to pay salaries and utilities. Whether you and your family attend every Church service and event, or you just attend the Christmas service, the bills have to be paid.

Both the expense side and the income side of the church budget need to be ad-

dressed. As Church Treasurer Anita Lowary reported in the December newsletter the Finance Committee has made as many cuts to the 2018 budget expenses as possible, but there are expected increases, also. It's up to the Church parishioners to help on the income side.

Our Church expenditures are projected to exceed Church revenue by about 15% this year. If every Church member gave 15% more, the problem will be solved. We are asking every member to examine their current giving. Perhaps it has been awhile since that giving has been increased, and going to the next level would not be too burdensome. For example, if you give \$5 per week, go to \$6 or \$10. Or, if you give \$100 monthly, jump to \$110 or \$125. Maybe you give electronically; call Myndi Kampa at 397-4530 to make an adjustment.

If everyone gave a little more, then the burden is spread around to all of the church members. Thank you.

To continue the ministry of Jesus we established Human Relations Day as a Special Sunday that calls all of our churches to participate in helping all God's children to realize their potential.

### Will You Support the Ministry of Christ Among Those on the Margins?

Will you continue to support Human Relations Day? Will you continue nurturing at-risk youth, strengthening communities' self-improvement efforts and advocating for the oppressed?

Rev. I Maliik Safir, whose church works with those gripped by addiction in Little Rock, sums up the work of Human Relations Day by recalling Jesus' story of the Good Samaritan: "to meet the poor, the disadvantaged and the underserved at the places where others have robbed them and help them to recover from the wounds of social inequality."
