### **Conde Ad Board - Sept**

The Conde Administrative Board met at 7:00 on Tuesday, September 18<sup>th</sup>. Much of the time was dedicated to informing Pastor Brandon about some of the things that we have done in the past and what projects we try to continue each year. President Cindy Smith presided over the meeting, and there were six persons present.

Reports from some of the committees were given.

No <u>Trustees</u> were present, but there was discussion on spraying for bugs inside and outside of the church.

Mission Chairman, Donna Hearnen reported that there are 25 School Kits and 14 Hygiene Kits ready to be packed into boxes, and Pat Siefken will deliver them to Allied Van Lines in Aberdeen . From there they go to an UMCOR depot to be distributed to needy areas in the United States. None of these will go oversees this year. The Conde Church will again work with North Highland Church in Aberdeen to provide funds, so they can purchase things for the Shoebox Christmas project, which benefits children at the Enemy Swim Day School. Another mission project which was discussed was World Hunger. We have been using the "loose offering" on the fourth Sunday to go to this mission. A new plan will be decided at our next meeting. Habitat for Humanity benefits from money that people give on their Birthdays.

Education – We don't have enough children for a Sunday School, but it was suggested that Pastor Brandon give a Children's Sermon when there are some in church, and also try and have them help with Communion and taking the offering. Community Bible School was discussed, and with more volunteers it it is hoped that this event can take place again next Summer. It was greatly missed.

<u>Memorial</u> <u>Chairman</u>, Patty Knoll reported that two tables have been purchased and installed in the little patio area on the east side of the church. They are like a picnic table with benches attached and are made of a heavy metal. There was quite a large sum of memorial money that had been collected, and these tables seemed to be a proper memorial.

<u>Clergy Report</u> by Pastor Brandon. He asked the group how much the congregation would like to participate in the Sunday service; such as Scripture Reading etc. Favorable comments were given on the order of worship that he is using. He reported that Charge Conference would be at the North Highland Church in Aberdeen on Sunday November 11<sup>th</sup> at 3:00. This will include several churches.

It was decided to try and have monthly Board Meetings with the time being the 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday at 7:00. Everyone is welcome to attend these meetings and it is encouraged that more church members and constituents would do so. At the October 9<sup>th</sup> meeting, the budget will be set and committee members will be nominated. This all has to be done before Charge Conference.
