Rev Hyde's Great-Grand-Daughter Visits

Friday morning, July 26, a group gathered to meet and greet Liz & John Rieken. It was a joy to gather and learn many things about the Reverend Hyde who started the Methodist Church in Groton.

"Dig or Die, Brother Hyde" is an autobiography cherished by the family. Liz said everyone has a copy, even the great-greatgreat-grandchildren! The family has read it several times. Rev & Mrs Hyde's daughter Ethel was Liz's grandmother; she is mentioned several times in the book. Ethel's daughter Dorothy, Liz's mother, is also mentioned. Interestingly, Liz is a fourth generation "Grace." Mrs Hyde was Mary ("Minnie") Grace, Liz's Grandmother was Ethel Grace. her mother was Dorothy Grace and she is Elizabeth Grace. Grandpa Hyde's sister was named Elizabeth ("Lizzie") but she is not sure if she was named after her or not.

Grandpa Hyde was a very strong influence on the family, even though he passed away in 1953 when Liz was an infant. Her two elder sisters knew him and had many stories to tell. Liz knew Ethel (grandmother) very well and was quite close to her. Through her she knew Grandpa Hyde. His strength of will and optimism were evident in her and she very much inspired the family in that way.


Rev Hyde was a central figure for the family by loving God and loving people. He was sharp, funny, and a great speaker. Had a great knack for fundraising as he moved through 15+ congregations and preached at many more places. (If you read the book, you will find he frequented the elevator at harvest time for donations to build the church in Groton) Rev Hyde believed in the immortality of the soul, name, and influence. He was known for his hard work and perseverance. Even in his mid 80's he would be

walking to keep up his health.






Rev Hyde Book

Chairman Brad Morehouse called the meeting to order at 7:08 pm. Those in attendance were: Brad & Diann Morehouse, Allen Walter, Pastor Brandon, Dale Kramer, Richard Krueger & Jeanne Wanous.

The agenda & previous minutes were approved on a motion by Dale Kramer & 2nd by Allen Walter.

Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report was reviewed and approved on a motion by Allen Walter and 2nd by Dale Kramer.

Financial Secretary: Allen Walter noted that we need to appoint a Financial Chair on the Finance Committee. Allen is listed as the chair but is actually the Financial Secretary. Allen did suggest that we form a sub-committee to plan for discussions in the fall regarding tithing and also the building fund.

Pastor/Parish: The PPR committee discussed new flooring & sheetrock for the NE room of the basement in the parsonage. They felt the cost would be approximately \$500 and asked the Ad Council for approval to complete the work. Dale Kramer motioned to approve the work at the parsonage and Richard Krueger 2nd the motion. All approved the motion.

Bills: There were no bills presented. Administrative Report: Pastor Bran-

don spoke about the upcoming VBS in both Conde and Groton. He posted the events on Facebook hoping to help let everyone know they are welcome. Brandon, Justin & Amanda Morehouse, and Laurie Mitchell will be attending the Youth & Children's Ministry Cohort training in Mitchell on July 27.

Committee Reports: Trustees: Richard Krueger reported that a dehumidifier is now running in the parsonage basement. It was determined that water leaking into the NE basement room was due to the gutters being plugged and no extended down spout. Both issues have been corrected. No mold was found after the incident.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:06 pm.
