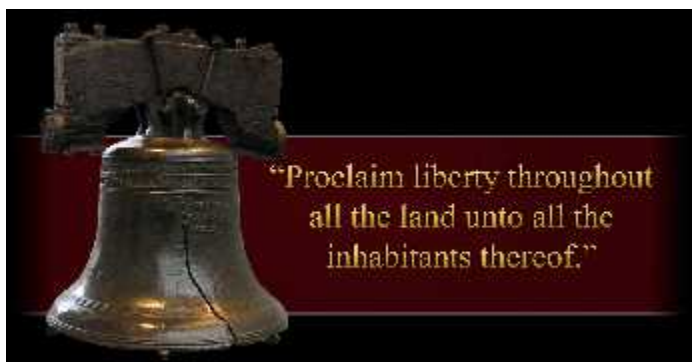

...from Pastor Brandon

Welcome Church Family,

I love you all so much and Jesus tells us to love God, the Father, by the way we love each other, His children. It has been such an honor to be your pastor for the last year. There were ten women in attendance for the monthly UMW meeting.

Vice President Gloria Pharis called the meeting to order. Members recited the UMW Purpose. Jeanne Wanous read the minutes from the previous meeting. She also shared the most recent Treasurer’s report.

Old Business: None

New Business:

-) Membership, Nurture, and Outreach: Pat Dahlquist, committee member, stated that we find that “Thinking of You” cards are used frequently and that we may need to place another order in the near future for more of them. Fortunately we have had some additional cards donated recently.
-) Thank You Received: Val Baker shared a thank you note and picture from a young boy who was a

recipient of a pool pass made possible by our UMW donation to the City Pool scholarship program.

-) Donation to Youth Ministry Cohort Program: Jeanne explained that the Groton UMC was selected by Dakota Conference as one of 10 churches to participate in a Youth Ministry Cohort Program where 4 or 5 of our youth leaders meet with a coach quarterly to learn ways to expand and enhance our children & youth ministries for a cost of \$250. On a motion by Val Baker & 2nd by JoAnn Krueger, we voted to donate the \$250 to the church to make our participation possible.
-) Donation to Groton Bene Anonymous Meals: On a motion by Diann Morehouse and 2nd by Val Baker, members voted to make a \$250 donation to the Groton Area Schools Bene Anonymous Meals fund.

-) Fall Rummage Sale Fundraiser: Members were reminded that we will be holding our next fundraiser on Sept. 7 by renting space to people who want to sell rummage sale items and by selling food. A sheet was passed around to sign up if you can help that day. Members were reminded that we are not soliciting items to be sold; we are just renting space and selling food.

The meeting ended with a prayer given by Val Baker and we were all then treated to a great lunch prepared by Diann Morehouse.

Groton Ad Council - June

Chairman Brad Morehouse called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Those in attendance were: Brad & Diann Morehouse, Meri Erickson, Marjorie Overacker, Richard Krueger, Allen Walter and Jeanne Wanous. Pastor Brandon offered a prayer prior to the business meeting.

The agenda & previous minutes were approved on a motion by Richard Krueger.

Treasurer's Report: It was noted that we continue to pay 50% of our monthly apportionments. The report was approved on a motion by Allen Walter.

Bills:

There was discussion regarding a large bill from Dave McGannon for work completed in 2017 & 2018 on the church building and a small amount for the parsonage. It was noted by Meri Erickson that \$90 of the bill was for the parsonage and was paid. Since there isn't enough money to pay the complete bill at once, the council approved a partial payment to come from the building fund.

Bills for confirmands flowers and gifts were not turned in for reimbursement as they were taken care of by church members as a donation.

There was discussion amongst the council that we have a budget shortfall of approximately \$2000 each month. This prompted more discussion of having stewardship talks with the congregation in the near future.

Administrative Report:

Pastor Brandon reported that the dates for Vacation Bible School will be August 8 & 9. Brandon also shared that the Groton UMC has been selected along with nine other churches to participate in the Youth Ministry Cohort Program. A team of 4-5 people from our congregation will participate in quarterly workshops which will provide training and development of a plan to create a healthy and sustainable youth ministries program for children and youth in our church. Committee Reports:

) **Trustees:** Richard Krueger had Brandon comment on recent water damage to the NE room of the parsonage basement. It is unknown how water got in, perhaps from snow melt, but the carpet and paneling need to be removed immediately. Then a plan needs to be developed to make the room a pleasant & usable space for Brandon & Ashley.

Old Business:

) **Refacing of Kitchen Cabinets:** Kitchen Tune-Up will be coming the week of June 24 to give an estimate to reface the cabinets. Monies for this would come from the Memorial fund.



New Business:

-) **Church Use Request:** Use of the church was approved by the council on the following dates: June 24-27 & July 15-18 from 9:00 am – 5:00 pm. It will be used for transition camp (as it has in the past 5 years) by students with disabilities. They will be learning life skills and in addition will perform cleaning in our church as well as make a \$100 donation.
-) **Community Free Produce Table Request:** Kay Daly made a request on behalf of the Tuesday morning Bible Study group to be allowed to offer free garden produce from our church parking lot to community members in need. The council OK'd the request.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:17 pm.

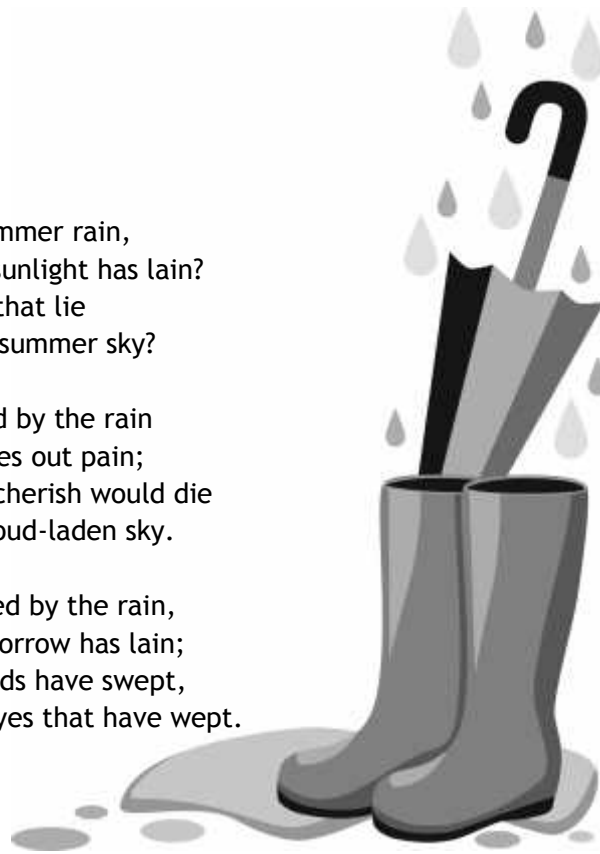
Summer Rain

PATRIOTIC PINWHEEL

Create this colorful July 4th craft.

What you need:

- Decorated card stock square (5" x 5")
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- 2 one-inch circles of card stock
- Glue
- Pipe cleaner (3 inches)
- Drinking straw



What you do:

1. Fold the square corner to corner to form an X. Unfold.
2. To make spokes, cut the four creases until an inch from the center.
3. Punch a hole in the middle of the square, near the tips of each spoke, and in the middle of each circle.
4. Fold each spoke toward the center, lining up the holes. Glue in place.
5. Wrap one end of the pipe cleaner around the top of the straw. Thread a circle, the pinwheel, and the remaining circle onto the pipe cleaner.
6. Roll the pipe cleaner end into a ball. Then spin!

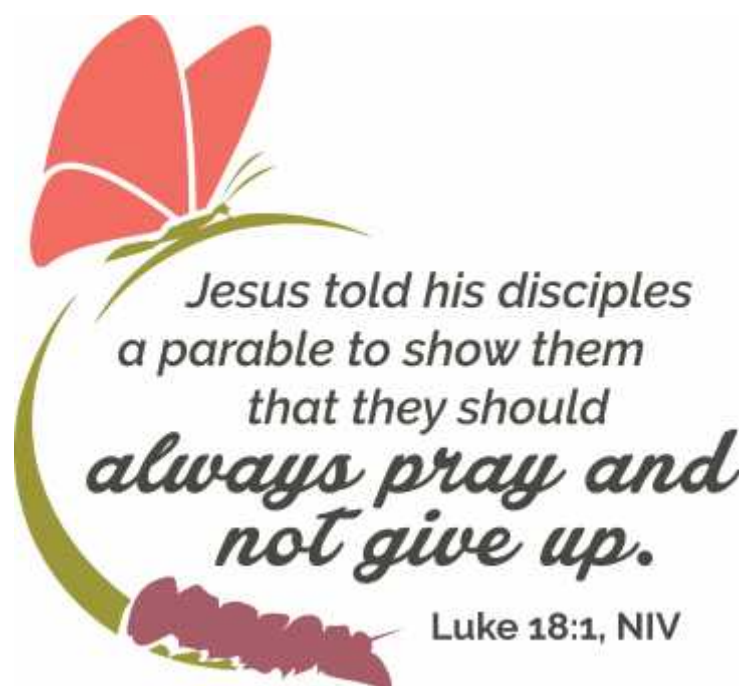
