

Chairman Brad Morehouse called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. In attendance were Pastor Brandon Dunham, Brad & Diann Morehouse, Dale Kramer, Marge Overacker, Roger Rix, Jeanne Wanous, Meri Erickson, Allen Walter, and Nick Strom. Pastor Brandon shared a prayer before the business meeting began.

Agenda & Minutes: The agenda and previous meeting minutes were approved on a motion to approve by Dale Kramer & 2nd by Marge Overacker.

Correspondence: None Treasurer's Report:

Church Treasurer: Marge Overacker reviewed the March treasurer's report. She explained that the Vanco monthly automatic offerings by members will now be deposited directly into the checking account instead of the savings account. This will avoid making a monthly transfer between accounts. It will also make it easier for annual auditors to follow transactions. It was noted that giving was better in March. The conference apportionment check for March was not written, it will be included in April activity. In addition, Marge shared a YTD budget report. The March Treasurer's Report was approved on a motion by Meri Erickson & 2nd by Roger Rix.

Financial Secretary: None

Pastor Parish Treasurer: Meri Erickson asked if it was ok to pay a bill from Locke Electric for work involving the parsonage furnace. The bill was allowed.

Bills to be Presented: Richard Krueger stated that the carpet cleaning bill from Dakota Restoration & Cleaning Service was \$764.67 with tax. This included cleaning of 6 chairs. Roger Rix moved to pay the bill upon completion of a recheck in some areas of concern. Motion approved. In addition Brad Morehouse and sons took one refrigerator home to discover what was causing a bad odor. They checked it out and cleaned it and

will probably return it soon as they feel it is not smelling and working ok.

Administrative Report:

Brandon reported that he has been busy with Holy Week planning. Also, a Poet grant for a community program was applied for but not approved by Poet. The community event will still happen. Lang's TV has been out to give an estimate of \$2900 on a new projector for the sanctuary. This does not include installation. We are also looking at memorial funds for this project.

Committee Reports:

Annual Audit Report: Roger Rix gave a summary of the annual audit. He stated that he was not sure if the Special Funds balance was correct and that he would follow up on that. He stated that it took a long time to get through the General Fund activity. He also noted that we need to get statements for the Dick Ruden Fund so we can audit it. Roger stated that monthly bank statement reconciliation pages are necessary. Marge Overacker asked that she be given an outline of what records are needed for the next audit.

Old Business:

Kitchen Update Memorial Project: Meri Erickson stated that Kitchen Tune-up will be coming to give an appraisal for kitchen cupboards. Nick Strom volunteered to contact another vendor for input.

Thank You's: Jeanne Wanous will send thank you notes to Marc Johnson & Adrian Daly for snow removal this past winter.

New Business:

<u>Yard Cleanup Weekend</u>. No specific date was decided, but some of the men present may get together and do some cleanup.

Dale Kramer motioned for the meeting to adjourn at 8:00 pm. Motion carried.


