Hello Church Family,

In keeping with our current Sermon series, I was wondering if I could point us towards another parable, and something that has struck my heart over the last month.

In the book of John, we see in just it's second chapter the first miracle Jesus ever performed. It's at the wedding in Cana where Jesus turns the water into wine. Because maybe it has been a while since we've read this story ourselves, let me give a quick synopsis...

There is a wedding celebration in the village of Cana in Galilee to which Jesus and his mother Mary are both in attendance. But then the worst thing imaginable takes place... They. Ran. Out. Of. Wine! Mary looks to her son Jesus and says, "They have no more wine." "That's not our problem", replies Jesus. (Yes. He said THAT to his mother.) Looking to nearby servants Mary tells them, "do whatever he tells you."

I'm not sure if I've ever realized before that the servants were the ones who were in on the miracle. Jesus asks them to fill pots with water and then to draw from those pots and




serve the party's host. We don't know when exactly the water changed into wine, but somewhere between filling and tasting, it did, and the servants were a part of every step. These people were literally the hands and feet that delivered the miracle.

Jesus is clearly passionate about allowing servant-hearted people the opportunity to experience and even deliver the wonders of God, which is why I've found recent church activity so exciting. We've been moving in the last few months. Dreaming, meeting, and serving this community just like the servants of Jesus in the story. And though we are few in number, know that if you're a willing participant, because I know that

God is barely scratching the surface with his church, God will invite you into something special too.

Stay with us. Keep praying. And remember that we are blessed so we can bless.

May 4th we begin a new study by Liz Curtis Higgs, "Bad Girls of the Bible." Please join us as we discuss and laugh.




women how *not* to handle the challenges of life.





Groton Ad Council - March

Pastor Brandon Dunham shared a prayer prior to the discussion of business. Chairman Lars Hanson called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm. Those in attendance were: Pastor Brandon Dunham, Jolene Townsend, Richard Krueger, Marjorie Overacker, Jeanne Wanous, Anita Lowary, Allen Walter, Valerie Baker and & Meri Erickson.

Agenda: The agenda was approved with one addition, a P.E.O. request to hold meetings at our church.

Minutes: The previous minutes were approved as written.

Correspondence: None

Treasurer's Report: Marjorie Overacker stated that we ended Feb. with a negative balance but noted that the ending balance doesn't include Dacotah Bank deposits made in Feb.

Finance Chairman Report: Allen Walter shared that the PPP loan he applied for came through for \$15,600. Next we will need to complete paperwork that shows we need it.

Allen also shared a spreadsheet of who has control over specific church related bank accounts and who has authorization for specific actions related to those different church bank accounts that have now been transferred from Wells Fargo Bank to Dacotah Bank. It was also noted that the MYF bank account has been closed and the money in that account was transferred to a specific line item under Sunday school in our general fund.

*Resolution: Meri Erickson moved to approve the Groton UMC bank account authorizations at Dacotah Bank as presented by Finance Chairman Allen Walter in his spreadsheet and to also approve moving the Boy Scout funds to the Sunday school line item general account fund. The motion was 2nd by Brent Morehouse.

All members present voted their approval. Administrative Council: See attached Dacotah Bank account authorization spreadsheet.

Pastor Parish: Meri Erickson stated that this account is doing well and that there were no concerns. She also confirmed that this account was closed & moved to Dacotah Bank on March 15.

Bills to be Presented: On a motion by Linda Thurston and 2nd by Anita Lowary, the council approved a budgeted item bill from the Conference in the amount of \$119.60 as well as a bill for piano tuning.

Administrative Report:

Pastor Brandon stated that there were no plans for a Good Friday service. He is currently sharing daily devotions on Facebook through Holy Week. Also, we are happy to be seeing a good number of new people attending church. There will be an upcoming spring dinner similar to the Fall Dinner. Coffee hour & Sunday school are going again. We have had technology struggles in last month which Kay is trouble shooting. We are still in need of a church camera instead of Pastor's Brandon's phone. The purchase of this was approved by the council in July 2020. And finally Pastor Brandon reminded everyone of the March 21 Sunday evening worship night which is being planned along with Groton's Christian & Missionary Alliance Church.

Committee Reports: None

Education Committee: Between 19-21 children have been attending Sunday school. The last day for Sunday School will be May 2.

Memorial: Linda Thurston provided the current balance of the Memorial Fund which is \$11,526.54.

Trustees: Richard Krueger is work-

ing with Locke Electric to repair 2 hallway lights. Quotes for resurfacing our parking lot won't be accepted until April 6. Once a quote is received the council can then decide if we want to move forward.

Old Business:

Status of Changing to Dacotah Bank: All accounts have been transferred.

PPP Loan: The PPP loan came through for \$15,600. Next we will need to complete paperwork that shows we need it.

New Business:

Trunk or Treat Date: On a motion by Valerie Baker & 2nd by Marjorie Overacker, the council voted to move our date from Oct. 31 to Oct. 29 to coincide with the Groton Chamber of Commerce downtown date.

<u>Bank Account Authorizations</u>: see above resolution.

Add Fiber Optic Internet: On a motion by Anita Lowary and 2nd by Brent Morehouse, the council approved adding an upgrade to the office internet with a Fiber Optic line. It should be noted that the payment of this will come from the PPR fund so they must also approve this.

<u>P.E.O.</u> Request: The P.E.O. group is asking for permission to resume meeting at our church. The council approved the request on a motion by Meri Erickson and 2nd by Jolene Townsend.

Coffee Hour with Homemade Food:
After some discussion, Richard
Krueger motioned & Brent Morehouse 2nd approval to begin offering homemade food at our Sunday pre-worship coffee hour beginning April 11, 2021.
