Hello Church Family,

Jesus answered, "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and the most important commandment. The second most important commandment is like it: 'Love your neighbor as vou love vourself.' Matthew 22:37–39

Who would you say your neighbor is? Is it everyone? Is it the people who live close to you? I've struggled with this question over the years because the answer is so important. Jesus said "all the law and prophets" hang on these two great commandments: love God and love your neighbor. Therefore we need to know what this means! For me. I've come to know my neighbor as anyone that I live near, work with, or come across on a semi- regular basis. Those are my people; that's my network.

But how do I love them effectively? In an era of garage doors, Amazon orders, and privacy fences, it can be especially hard to find good ways to love my neighbor. I mean... I hardly see them most of the



time! Also, if I do, we both tend to be pretty busy with our own business it seems.

What the scriptures tell us is that loving God and loving our neighbor; those two things are connected. When we love God, God's love then flows back through us in a loving relationship. And it's so natural that, in our relationships with others, God's love will continue to flow through us, reaching our network of friends and family. It doesn't always need to be anything grand, but by abiding in God and drawing from that well regularly, even short interactions with others are blessed by the presence of God (the greatest definition of love there is). Isn't that cool! But the question remains: how do we do this well?

This fall we are going to have a bit of fun. We're bringing back Sunday School and youth programming, I will personally be hosting a Bible study (contact for details) for any who wish to attend, we're HAVING A POTLUCK on Rally Sunday and we're going to have conversations about what it means to invite others into our circle. To extend the range of our love through first, drawing from the love of God ourselves, but then intentionally seeking those in our lives that we do not reflect the love of God with well.

What would happen if a community of faith embraced Jesus' vision for being a neighbor? What might Jesus unleash as we invite people into our ordinary lives and share our stories? Join us this fall as we journey towards radically ordinary hospitality, carried by the love of God.

Groton Committee Positions Available

The Nominating Committee for the Groton United Methodist Church is preparing for their annual meeting to fill the positions needed for the operation and activities of the church. Although the positions do not start until January 1, 2022, all nominations must be accepted at the committee level and again at the Official Annual Charge Conference and this year that date is currently set for October 27, 2021.

Our Groton congregation has had the following appointed committees in operation for the last few years: Administrative Council; Pastor/Parish Relations Committee; Nominations Committee; Finance Committee; Education Committee; Trustees Board; Memorial Committee; Missions Committee; Music & Worship Committee; Hospitality Connections Team; Audit Committee; and the Permanent Endowment Fund Board. Other committees are set up and filled for special projects.

Several of these committees meet one time per year. Others meeting quarterly, monthly, or when determined by the committee chairperson. Committees vary in number of members from 3 to 20. Although most committees are named for their main function, the following list gives a brief description of each of standing committees:

The Administrative Council oversees all committees, activities, and business of the church. They receive reports, initiate or approve planning, set goals, authorize

actions, determine policy, evaluate ministries, and review the state of the church.

The Pastor/Parish Relations Committee coordinates the churches in the parish and the pastor. Working with the conference to supply clergy for the churches, and keeping effective communications, ministries, and relationships with the memberships of the churches and pastor.

The Nominations Committee which is chaired by the pastor provides candidates for offices and committees each year.

The Finance Committee creates the annual budget of the church and works to insure sufficient income to meet the annual budget and other major projects.

The Education Committee is responsible for the church's educational activities and projects (Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, Confirmation, Bible Studies, and any special programs for all ages). The Committee sets policies, selects curriculum, and recruits teachers and assistants.

The Trustees Board is responsible for the needs and inventory of the property and buildings owned by the church. This includes maintenance, repairs, and insurance. The Trustees are also the custodians of all legal papers.

The Memorial Committee receives memorials, acknowledges these memorials with thank you notes, and assists in selecting appropriate needed projects and furnishings. The Missions Committee selects activities and projects for sharing the teaching of the church locally and worldwide. The Music & Worship Committee helps the pastor with selections of style of worship, types of music, furnishings, details, and other practices of worship.

The Hospitality Connections Team recommends activities to care for members and new or inactive persons. They provide additional care and comfort to those in need; welcoming visitors and supporting new persons; and assisting with blessing showers, funerals, and ministries of caring.

The Audit Committee conducts the annual audit of the church financial records and provides the summary report. The Permanent Endowment Fund Board reviews, manages, and provides opportunities for members and friends of the church to make charitable gifts to the church for projects needed in addition to annual giving.

The Nominating Committee is seeking volunteers to help fill several positions on several committees for 2022. If we want the church to be there for our needs, we must also be willing to participate in church activities. This is a great opportunity for each of us to work at the church in a field that interests each of us. Please contact Pastor Brandon Dunham as soon as possible if you are willing to serve in any of these ways.



Prayer bracelet

Make this craft to help you remember the Lord's Prayer.



What you need:

- Elastic string (12 inches)
- Colored beads (see below)
- Clear nail polish

What you do:

- 1. Knot the string at one end. Add beads in this order: blue, white, gold, green, yellow, red, black, orange
- 2. Tie the ends so the bracelet fits your wrist. Place a dot of nail polish to secure the knot. Trim excess string.
- 3. As you pray, use the bead colors as reminders of Jesus' words (see Matthew 6:9-13):
 - **blue** = the Father
 - white = God's holiness
 - **gold** = God's kingdom
 - **green** = the earth
 - **yellow** = wheat (bread)
 - red = Christ's blood (forgiveness)
 - **black** = temptation
 - **orange** = God's power to deliver

Patriot Day

On December 18, 2001, Congress approved a joint resolution designating September 11 of each year as "Patriot Day." It's a day to remember the more than 3,000 innocent lives lost on that September morning in 2001.

The resolution requests that each year the President issue a proclamation calling on the American people and state and local governments to observe the day with appropriate programs and activities. Those activities include remembrance services, candlelight vigils, moments of silence, and flying the American flag at half-staff.

In his 2003 proclamation President Bush said, "On that day, and in its aftermath, we saw the greatness of America in the bravery of victims; in the heroism of first responders who laid down their lives to save others; in the compassion of people who stepped forward to help those they had never met; and in the generosity of millions of Americans who enriched our country with acts of service and kindness."



Those in attendance were: President Lars Hanson, Allen Walter, Meri Erickson, Marjorie Overacker, Valerie Baker, Anita Lowary, Linda Thurston, Richard Krueger, and Jeanne Wanous.

Agenda & Previous Minutes: Motion to approve by Richard Krueger, 2nd by Val Baker and approved by all.

Committee Reports:

Education: Sunday school will begin Sept 12 with Rally Sunday: Those who have volunteered to be teachers so far are Meri Erickson, Val Baker, and Megan Erickson. We are still looking for volunteers.

<u>UMW</u>: UMW will resume again on Thursday, September 16th at 1:30 pm.

<u>Missions</u>: Val Baker will be scheduling a meeting soon.

Memorial: Linda Thurston stated that she had been asked to use undesignated memorial money to purchase an anti-fatigue matt for by the kitchen sink. She shared options she had found and on a motion by Allen Walter & 2nd by Anita Lowary, the council gave Linda permission to use her judgement to select and purchase a matt of her choice with the undesignated memorial money.

<u>Trustees</u>: Richard Krueger had asked Anita Lowary to check on cost of paving our parking lot by the same company doing the city roads. Anita stated that their quote was too high so she declined. In the past they had given us a reduced price (same as the city pays), but not this year. Richard noted that the 5G fiber installation had begun for the church & parsonage.

Treasurer's Report:

cussed the current savings & checking balances and noted that member contributions have fallen off over the summer months and may soon begin to affect our ability to meet our monthly budget needs. Pastor Parish: Meri Erickson stated that the Pastor Parish budget is doing well.

Pastor Brandon shared that he visited with our NE District Superintendent, Rev. Kris Mutzenberger, regarding a date for Groton's annual Charge Conference.
