# ...Pastor Rob's Ponderings

Do you keep a regular "prayer time" each day? Don't worry; this is not a trick question. I recently received an email from a friend talking about the number of times he has changed his "prayer time" or his "devotional time" with God which got me thinking about this question. Unfortunately, I've fallen into the habit of tossing, "I'm praying for you," around as casually as saying "Good Morning" to someone. My friend's email has me thinking about prayer. When do I pray? How do I pray? Is there a specific way to pray?

You might be asking, "Pastor Rob, you're our pastor. Prayer should come naturally to you." My friend's email reminded me even the apostles needed the help of Jesus to learn how to pray. I'm often asked to pray before events or gatherings when I would rather stand in the back and listen to someone else. My "prayer time" has been sporadic at best. I wish I could say I'm like one of the saints of the church who rises each morning at 5:30 am and spends an hour or two in prayer, but that's not me. I wish I could point to a specific devotional book or guide which helps me follow a pattern of prayer. I haven't found a good one of those, other than the Bible itself. I wish I knew all the answers.

Instead of the answers, I've learned a new way of



thinking. I'm not sure how one of my close friends became my friend. I had just started pastoring in three small churches in North Dakota. As a new pastor in a new state, I knew it was important for me to get to know other pastors. Back in the day, the North Dakota United Methodist Churches held "Convo." It was weekend youth rally usually held in Jamestown ND. Even though I was new and had no youth I knew in any of my churches, I decided to check out this "Convo." When I arrived, other pastors knew who I was but were surprised I would show up alone. It made me feel kind of strange. One of the people who didn't make me feel strange was a pastor who seemed to be in charge. He welcomed me, told me to follow him around, introduced me to people, and just

visited with me. We haven't stopped visiting since. He's one of my closest friends. And I think I know why - he started a relationship. Yes, it started at a "special event" but it didn't require it. My friend and I rarely see each other more than once or twice a year, but we are always visiting on the phone or by email. If you ran into him in Mandan, North Dakota and discovered he knew Rob Moorlach, he could tell you how I was doing and I would do the same. It's about relationship.

Matthew 6:6 says, "But when you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you." Different people have dissected this verse over the centuries since Jesus said it. What did he mean by "room," what if there are oth-

er people around, do my prayers in front of others work? What I'm discovering is there are two people involved – God and me. My heavenly Father already knows my heart, He knows the joys and concerns, He knows all about me. But Jesus still says, "Go into your room and pray to your Father."

I might not have a certain time you can drive by the parsonage in the morning or late night when you can see the light on and know I'm praying but I'm learning to spend time in my relationship with God each day. I encourage you to do the same.

## Membership Update Letter






#### Good Friday, March 29th

#### Pressed

*Gethsemane*, the name of the place where Jesus prayed before his betrayal, is an Aramaic word for "olive press." During Bible times, olives were pressed three times to remove all the valuable oil. Before being arrested in the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus felt the full pressing weight of our sins on his shoulders. Surrounded by olive trees, praying fervently while sweating drops of blood, the perfect Son of God asked his heavenly Father three times to remove the cup of suffering.

Instead of removing that trial, God used it to redeem and save humankind. Likewise, God uses our hardships to refine and strengthen our faith.

In *The Rock, the Road and the Rabbi*, TV host Kathie Lee Gifford and Messianic Rabbi Jason Sobel speculate that if Peter, along with James and John, hadn't fallen asleep in Gethsemane, he may have had the strength to not deny Jesus later that night.

"All of us must be vigilant to watch and pray so that we don't succumb to the temptation to deny the Lord when we go through the olive presses of life and feel like we are being crushed by our situation and circumstances," the authors write. "We must remember that it is the crushing that brings out the true inner value and worth of the olive."



Use batik, a unique fabric-dying method, to create flags celebrating the good news of Christ's resurrection.



#### What you need:

- Colored chalk
- White linen fabric
- Washable gel glue
- Acrylic craft paint
- Textile medium
- Paintbrushes

#### What you do:

- 1. Cut fabric to the desired size and shape. Set it on a flat, protected surface. With chalk, lightly sketch an Easter design or message.
- 2. Completely cover the chalk lines with gel glue. Let dry.
- 3. Mix equal parts paint and textile medium. Paint the flag with that mixture, which makes paint permanent. Let dry.
- 4. Soak the dried fabric in warm water a few minutes. Then gently peel away the glue to reveal the unpainted areas. Lay flat to dry.
- 5. Hang the flags and celebrate!

## Groton Ad Council - Feb

The meeting was called to order by Chairman, AM Mitchell. Those in attendance were Linda Thurston, Carna Atherton-Pray, Anita Lowary, Tyke Nyberg, Roger Rix, Meri Erickson, and Jeanne Wanous. Pastor Rob was not able to attend. The chairman asked Carna to share a prayer.

The <u>agenda</u> was approved on a motion from Anita Lowary.

The <u>previous meeting minutes</u> were approved on a motion from Linda Thurston.

Correspondence: The secretary shared a thank you note from Linda (Snyder) Sparkman on behalf of the Carolyn Snyder family for the reception held at our church in memory of Carolyn.

#### **Committee Reports**

Membership: Anita Lowary shared information on the results of the membership letter recently mailed out. Of the 138 letters sent out, 4 were returned for inaccurate address & 32 responses were completed & received back. Of those 20 asked to be removed as members and some added additional children, gave updated addresses, and some shared updated photos.

#### Trustees:

- Tyke Nyberg shared the following:

   Heartland heating looked at the issue found by the boiler inspector, and they explained what needed to be done to comply with the inspection fault. Tyke gave them approval to complete the work.
- The City of Groton alerted us to an abnormally high usage of water concern. Tyke pinpointed the issue and fixed it, however as a result we have a higher-than-normal water bill coming up.
- Tyke shared the snow removal bill from Weber Landscaping thus far this winter. After discussion,
- Roger Rix motioned to pay the bill in full, from our undesignated memorial funds and the regular church funds will be used to repay undesignated memorial funds as we are able. The motion passed unanimously. It was

also suggested that we add snow removal as a line item in our budget for next year. In addition, Tyke will visit with Weber Landscaping on a way to reduce the number of snow removal hours for the remaining winter months.

#### **Treasurer's Report:**

- Church Treasurer-Jeanne Wanous: Jeanne reported that the Interfaith Bank account has been closed and the balance of \$20 has been received. Also, the annual Foundation distribution has been received. Anita reported that the money was distributed to camping and building fund.
- <u>Financial Secretary</u>-Allen Walter: no report

Pastor Parish-Meri Erickson: no report

#### Memorial Report:

Linda Thurston reported the following memorial funds:

- Undesignated = \$ 11,215.00
- Designated = \$13,737.44
- Total = \$24,952.44

She also reported that the memorial committee met to discuss ideas for use of undesignated memorial funds. The committee suggested the following use for a portion of the undesignated funds: 1) New speakers and switches for the fellowship hall at a cost of approx. \$3000; 2) Replenish our 3<sup>rd</sup> grade and baby Bible inventory at a cost of approx. \$1000; and 3) Purchase front hallway LED lights. Anita Lowary motioned to go forward with the committee's suggestions. The motion passed.

**Bills to be Presented**: The parking lot & sidewalk snow removal bill was turned over to the memorial treasurer as discussed above.

#### **Administrative Report**:

Pastor Rob: Carna Atherton-Pray shared that Pastor Rob will be on vacation on April 7 and Carna has agreed to be his substitute. Pastor Rob will also be gone on June 9 for the Annual Conference, as well as on June 16 for vacation.

#### **Old Business:**

• Fellowship Hall speakers: see above notes under memorial committee.

#### **New Business:**

- Carna Atherton-Pray reported that the new AED will be installed before the end of February. She also stated that there was not enough interest to support a training program for the device or for a CPR course.
- Meri Erickson proposed a bonus payment for Yvonne Lange for her volunteer hours helping with the Sunday school music program. All members in attendance were in agreement to this proposal and authorized the treasurer to pay the agreed on bonus amount to Yvonne.
