...from Pastor Rob

Isaiah 42:1-4 - Here is my servant! I have made him strong. He is my chosen one; I am pleased with him. I have given him my Spirit, and he will bring justice to the nations. ² He won't shout or yell or call out in the streets. ³ He won't break off a bent reed or put out a dying flame, but he will make sure that justice is done. ⁴ He won't quit or give up until he brings justice everywhere on earth, and people in foreign nations long for his teaching. (Contemporary English Version)

It's a few days before Palm Sunday so I'm getting swamped with "last minute ideas" for Holy Week. One of the bible websites sending me things sent out, "Scriptures for Holy Week" and this passage from Isaiah was at the top. It has struck a chord with me.

A couple of weeks ago I made the trip to Rapid City to cheer on our Groton Boys Basketball team at the State Tournament. It was fun to be with so many Groton fans cheering on our boys. Besides the families from our church who have players on the team, I visited with several other church people. Even though the outcome of the tournament wasn't in our favor, we finished with a win and our boys gave everything on the court.

A unique aspect to the game of basketball (actually you could apply this to almost any team sport) is the role of the "star" player(s) and the role of the "role" player(s).



Star players are the ones who usually end up with the most points, who make the key shot or hit the homerun or hit the most spikes. People will often keep their eyes on the stars and sometimes go to the games just to watch them. Role players are so named because they "play a role." They might score many points, hit a homerun, or make a few saves, but they are more likely to get rebounds from missed shots, set the ball so someone can get a spike, or get an out in a key spot. Role players do not get noticed or interviewed in the newspaper after the game. They are not out front.

I realize when it comes to Holy Week and Easter Jesus is out at center stage; the focus is on him. He is literally the sacrificial lamb "which takes away the sins of the world. " (John 1:29) It is the work of Jesus through his death on the cross and then his resurrection on Easter Sunday which brings about not only the forgiveness of sin but new life and a restored relationship with God. There is no doubt Jesus is not only the main actor in this drama, he is the star. Nothing in this story happens without him.

Yet Isaiah seems to also suggest Jesus is also a "role player" in these events. He is the servant who is not yelling or screaming, who is not giving up until the job gets done, who God the Father has chosen for the job and is well pleased with him.

I like this side of Jesus. I like watching the role players in sporting competition; they are the ones who "give life" and energy to their teammates.

Yes, Jesus is the star of Easter. He is the Son of the

Living God who humbled Himself to even death on the cross (Phil. 2:5-11). But He's also the one who gives life and energy to each of His children. Happy Easter!

Laughabili-TEA (Proverbs 17:22) A joyful heart helps healing, but a broken spirit dries up the bones.


Be sure to get a full cup. This blend of tea has medicinal purposes and I sure feel good when I drink this one. May I have a refill, please?

Blessed are You

The Beatitudes receive little attention, lamented novelist Kurt Vonnegut. "But, often with tears in their eyes, [Christians] demand that the Ten Commandments be posted in public buildings. And, of course, that's Moses, not Jesus. I haven't heard [anyone] demand that the Sermon on the Mount, the Beatitudes, be posted anywhere."

Jesus' Beatitudes have much to teach about selflessness, mourning, peacemaking and more. Jim Berger, author of *Being Sermon on the Mount Christians*, explains that those teachings were once "viewed as a mandate for the faithful." Post-Reformation, they became less law-like and more of a "liberating directive." Berger writes, "For Jesus, being and doing are inseparable. The Sermon is at once theory and praxis. It is not enough to read it or hear it. Jesus intends it to be how we live."



Use scrap paper to fuel new growth and make a gift that keeps on giving.

What you need:

- Scrap paper
- Water
- Herb or flower seeds
- Blender
- Strainer
- Cookie sheet
- Towel
- Adult help

What you do:

- 1. Tear the scrap paper into strips and place in a bowl. Cover the paper with water and let it soak overnight.
- 2. Pour the mixture into a blender and blend about 10 seconds.
- 3. Strain and squeeze the paper pulp to remove excess water. Place in a bowl.
- 4. Sprinkle seeds over the pulp and mix to incorporate them into the pulp.
- 5. Shape the pulp into a flat layer on the cookie sheet. Use a towel to soak up excess water. Allow the paper to dry completely.
- Tear paper into shapes or fold into a card. You can plant the paper directly into soil. Water it and then watch your plants grow!





Ad Council - March Minutes

The meeting was called to order by Chairman, AM Mitchell. Those in attendance were Linda Thurston, Carna Atherton-Pray, Anita Lowary, Roger Rix, Lon Gellhaus, Meri Erickson, and Jeanne Wanous. Pastor Rob shared a prayer prior to the discussion of business.

The <u>agenda</u> was approved on a motion from Carna Atherton-Pray.

The <u>previous meeting minutes</u> were approved on a motion from Anita Lowary.

Correspondence: Jeanne shared the following items from Dakotas Methodist Foundations: An announcement about a new short-term investment option through Wespath Institutional Investments. From Dakotas Methodist Foundations: A copy of their 2022/2023 Annual Report.

Committee Reports

Annual Audit: Anita Lowary shared copies of the 2023 audit. She reviewed the components showing: 1) Beginning funds; 2) Revenues; 3) Expenses; and 4) Ending Funds. There were no concerns, however Anita suggested we discontinue keeping a separate account for the Building Fund and combine it with the General Fund. After some further discussion, Roger Rix motioned to go forward with Anita's suggestion. The motion passed. Membership: Anita shared her report stating that membership letters were sent out to 138 separate families or individuals. There was no response received from 52 families/individuals. This could be because they had no changes, or because they weren't interested. For those members who requested to be withdrawn from our membership list, the committee will go ahead and remove them from the list. Memorial Report: Linda Thurston reported the following memorial funds:

- Undesignated = \$ 11,186.40
- Designated = \$ 14,762.44
- Total = \$25,948.84

Linda shared that memorial funds will be used for new speakers to be installed in the fellowship hall on March 21. In addition, a suggestion by the SS department to also purchase two microphones at a cost of \$326.98 was agreed to. This will make it possible for the children to be heard by those watching services on the internet. There was additional discussion on going forward with kitchen remodeling using memorial funds. Pastor Rob suggested we have a committee put together recommendations on kitchen remodel details. Meri Erickson & Carna Atherton-Pray volunteered to be on the committee.

Trustees: Pastor Rob reported that a new garbage disposal was installed at the parsonage as the other one was impossible to fix.

Treasurer's Report:

<u>Church Treasurer-Jeanne Wanous:</u> Jeanne stated that she and Kay are working on completing an audit requested by Grinnell Insurance for the period of Nov 7, 2022 – Nov 7, 2023. <u>Financial Secretary</u>-Allen Walter: no report <u>Pastor Parish</u>-Meri Erickson: no report

Bills to be Presented: Carna presented bills in the amount \$156.35 for replenishment of paper and plastic products for the kitchen. In addition, she presented a bill in the amount of \$207.00 for a second set of adult patches for the new AED, which is now installed in the sanctuary. Linda Thurston motioned to pay both bills, the motion passed.

Administrative Report:

Pastor Rob: Our upcoming schedule includes Palm Sunday service at 10:30 am, Maundy Thursday service with communion at 6:30 pm and we will share a Good Friday service with Emmanuel Lutheran at their church at 7:00 pm. Carna Atherton-Pray will fill in for Pastor Rob on April 7.

Old Business:

Fellowship Hall speakers: see above

New Business:

• <u>Anita Lowary--IRS certified letter</u> <u>received</u>: Anita explained a situation with the IRS where they believe we didn't pay payroll taxes for one quarter in 2018. After some discussion, the board suggested the fastest way to resolve this would be to go directly to the IRS office in Aberdeen to get a resolution to the issue.

<u>vMix Request by Kay Daly</u>: Kay would like permission to buy a vMix live production video mixer and switcher for Windows at a cost of \$350 if the free version she applied for does not come through. This will allow us to stream services on both Facebook and YouTube at the same time. Anita Lowary moved to approve Kay's request and the motion passed.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:56 pm.
