## ...from Pastor Rob

Psalm 18:30 - God's way is perfect. All the Lord's promises prove true. He is a shield for all who look to him for protection.

A news article caught my eye the other day. The headline read, "We need to adjust our clocks." I thought it was just another opinion piece opinion why we should Daylight Savings Time and the sluggishness of Congress to do it. (On a personal note, I would simply like us to stay on the same time so I never get caught being too early or too late for something.)

However, the article was actually about the fact we have "lost" about one second over the course of the past few years. How do we "lose" time? The article went on to explain most people understand a trip around the sun to be 24 hours; the problem with the assumption is that a trip around the sun takes "about" 24 hours and thinking about it that way leads to an incorrect assumption.

When the "atomic clock" was invented, scientists thought they could get the precise time nailed down. But the problem



with the atomic clock is that the earth and the universe are constantly moving and "adjusting." One scientist compared the earth's subtle movements to the settling of a house. Scientists have discovered the earth moves according to several factors including the heating and cooling cycle of its molten core and the pull and tug of the moon's gravity. So, because of all this movement, we've lost a second somewhere in the last few years.

My opinion is that God is having a real good laugh over all of this concern about time and how we calculate it. I know God has a great sense of humor, and it would not surprise me if He is not One "pulling and tugging" or "heating and cooling."

More importantly, I think God gets a chuckle out of what we pursue in a search for perfection. While getting time right is important for many things (Did you know, for example, when setting the timing of respirators people need to breathe, doctors "time in" a person taking a sigh about every ten breaths?), we need to keep in mind the only One who is perfect is God. And while we reach for perfection in seeking to follow Jesus, God does not get mad or frustrated with us when we don't reach it. Instead, He helps us up, forgives us and is our "shield" as we press on. See you in church!

<u>Memorial—Linda Thurston</u>: As of Aug. 31., our memorial funds are:

\$9,061.67 undesignated + 15,448.60 designated = \$24,510.27 total

<u>Missions--Val Baker:</u> Val was not present but left \$81 from the Sept. 15 Potluck to be deposited.

<u>Caring Team—Jolene Townsend:</u>
Jolene encouraged discussion on how to get more people to attend Potlucks.

She also shared that the Caring Team meeting was well attended. They continue to send "get well", "Thinking of You", and "Celebration" cards.

They will start up the Secret Angel & PAM (Pastor Appreciation) programs that the UMW used to do, as well as the Baby Blessing Showers.

Additional ideas include: Trunk or Treat participation, Secret Sister or Brother during Lent, and a possible young people's Bible Study.

<u>Trustees</u>: Tyke Nyberg was not present but sent word that our church insurance premium will be increasing for next year. Anita Lowary motioned to renew our coverage with same provider, and the motion was unanimously approved.
