...Pastor Rob's Ponderings

"This miraculous sign at Cana in Galilee was the first time Jesus revealed his glory. And his disciples believed in him." John 2:11

I've been pondering this verse for awhile. couple of weeks ago I preached on the first miracle of Jesus from John's Gospel in which he changed water into wine. In the message I asked the question, "When was the last time you've seen a miracle?" (In Groton, I talked to the children about the "miracle" of running water in my grandparent's farmhouse, perhaps not the example of "miracle."). Over the past couple of days I've come to realize I should have asked the question in a different way. I should have asked, "When was the last time you saw the glory of God in your life?" This question is more relatable, and more importantly, like the miracle of turning water into wine, it brings the focus back to Jesus doing the work (ie. "this was the first time Jesus revealed his glory."). Let me give you a good example. Yesterday, I was driving my early morning bus route when



after driving into a farmvard, I was amazed to see a picturesque sky as we headed East out of the farmyard. The clouds had an amazing reddish pink color which billowed over and over from the horizon. It was so amazing several high schoolers stood on the bus and tried to capture it on their cell phones. I slowed down and even asked if they wanted me to stop for a minute so they could capture the scene. It was truly amazing! I've seen vistas in the mountains at sunrise or sunset which will take your breath away. I've viewed the wonderful expanse of the sea shimmering at sunrise and sunset from cruise ships. And it's pretty hard to describe sunsets on the rolling prairies of South

Dakota or southern Minnesota.

Yet, Jesus revealed His glory again yesterday. Perhaps He was trying to get my attention as to what His glory can really do. I don't want to trivialize miracles or even the working of God. Many of us have seen amazing pictures in the skies created by our environment, and there are many amazing things we may see, hear or touch which make us smile, shake our heads, or even feel warm inside.

What I'm describing, though, are those "glory sightings" which turn our hearts and minds back to Jesus. The miracles in John's Gospel were "signs" of Jesus – who He is and what He came to do. I'm sure I've seen the same

atmospheric conditions which caused the clouds to turn an amazing color before. What got me thinking about God's glory was I think Jesus gave me this wonderful gift.

When was the last time you saw His glory? See you in church!

Pastor Rob wrote this article some time ago so I would have a few on hand. Well, with him in the hospital, this is a very appropriate message for us all.

Make these sweet sandwiches for a Mother's Day tea party.

What you need:

- 4 oz. cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 3 Tablespoons powdered sugar
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 6-10 strawberries, washed and sliced
- 6 slices of white bread
- Cellophane
- Adult help



What you do:

- 1. With an electric mixer, whip the cream cheese in a bowl until fluffy.
- 2. Add cream, powdered sugar, and lemon juice. Continue whipping on high speed until mixture is stiff.
- 3. On each slice of bread, spread a layer of the mixture. Then arrange some sliced strawberries on top.
- 4. Place the sandwiches together, with filling on the inside.
- 5. Wrap tightly in cellophane. Chill for two hours so the filling sets.
- 6. Trim off crusts with a serrated knife. Cut sandwiches in squares or triangles. Serve and enjoy!

Correspondence: Jeanne Wanous shared the following...

Dakotas Conf. sent out information on several companies to consider if we are thinking of making any changes in the future for insurance and liability coverage.

Kessler's of Aberdeen sent a notice to inform us that because of new ownership, any charge accounts we may have had are now closed.

Dakotas Methodist Foundations Annual Report booklets came in the mail and were made available to council members who were interested.

cancer treatments, and to wish them all a blessed Easter.

Jolene also suggested that we schedule a church yard clean-up. The council agreed to schedule this for Wednesday, April 30 at 10:30 am following the weekly coffee gathering. A second time is also scheduled for later that day, April 30 at 4:00 pm, for anyone who couldn't be there at 10:30 am session.
